15 lessons of 60 minutes am + walking programme

This is a course for people who would like to combine learning English in the mornings with afternoons spent walking through the wonderful landscape of Devon & Cornwall, walking along the beautiful coastline and in the national park.

	Description	Approx. length:
Monday:	 A walk along the lovely coast path joining Paignton & Brixham – an ideal introduction to the English Riviera!	10 km
Tuesday:	 Dartmoor circular walk – starting from the picturesque village of Widecombe in the Moor.	14 km
Wednesday:	free afternoon - either excursion with school or optional walk (not included in price)	
Thursday:	 Coleton Fishacre circular coast walk, to include visit to House and gardens at Coleton Fishacre and cream tea.	7 km
Friday:	 The picturesque coastline at Dartmouth / Little Dartmouth.	9 km
Saturday:	 Day trip to Cornwall: The Atlantic coast, in the footsteps of King Arthur! Tintagel-Boscastle Coast walk, with entrance to Tintagel Castle included.	10 km

These are moderate walks – approximately 3 hours for the afternoons and 3-4 hours for the Saturday walk. We recommend walkers to bring appropriate clothing for the time of year. You will need:

Walking boots

Waterproof / windproof coat

Waterproof / quick-drying trousers

Ruck sack

Clothes suitable for walking in England at the appropriate time of year.

And anything else you would normally take on a walk of this length in the countryside.

The group will be a maximum of 14 participants.

All these walks are accompanied by an experienced Devon School guide with great experience of the area and region, its landscape and flora and fauna. The guide is also equipped with a first aid kit, mobile phone and g.p.s positioning unit.

Participants should be comfortable with walks of these lengths involving uphill climbs. This course can naturally be combined as part of a longer English course at the school.
